## Victim Takes Lie Detector Test Today

Joseph R. Alden, 35-year-old victim of a strong-armed robbery here last Thursday, will submit to a lie detector test in Los Angeles this morning, according to Det. Captain Ernest Ashton, who is investigating the case.

Alden, manager of the National Supply Company Employees Credit Union, was slugged and robbed of \$30,000 near the intersection of Border ave. and Double st., late Thursday. He volunteered to take the lie detector test, Ashton said. Early this week police officials sent out an all-points bulletin to police agencies throughout Southern California to pick up and hold two suspects. Police Chief John Stroh reported yesterday, though, that the case is far from solved.

The chief pointed out that his department had offered escort to Alden when carrying large sums of money, but that the offer had been turned down.

Alden resides in Lomita, with his wife and three children.

Police Officer Eugene Erbetta Jr. has been seen passing out cigars this week following the birth last Friday of a daughter.


The little girl, whom the Erbettas have named Karen Lee, was born at Torrance Memorial Hospital. She is their first child.
