He gave up but one hit in each of the first, third, fourth and fifth innings, and whiffed seven batters. Third baseman Ronnie Hase hit the only extra base hit for the losers, a double to left field in the second inning. Second baseman Gary Smith and centerfielder Ted Kosenko each belted out a single to account for the remaining hits off Hunts offerings.
