The board of education Tuesday night approved the setting up of a Pullman-type kitchen, to be known as a dining patio, at the Madrona elementary school.

The building will be the first of its kind in the state of California and it is quite possible that it will revolutionize all future constructions of its kind if successful, it was stated.

The \$30,000 enterprise is built on the theory that a Pullman-type set-up will save space, require fewer employees, make it possible to serve 360 children in three shifts, and provide lunches at about one-third the usual cost, it was announced.

If this pilot kitchen proves successful, it will be introduced throughout the district, funds permitting.
