 Torrance is the third or fourth area in all of California to get such a new telephone system. There are only a few places even as far as the whole country is concerned which have this set-up. Eventually the system will be introduced on a national scale, it was disclosed.
 The greatest benefit to be derived from these machines, Pyle stated, is that they will reduce the possibility of error and delay and provide a maximum of efficiency through the greater elimination of human factors.
 However, none of the operators here are losing their jobs with Pacific Telephone, Pyle pointed out. About 35 girls will remain in the old office to handle "O" operator calls on the remaining positions of the switchboard. The other operators are being reassigned to offices of their choice in nearby exchanges.
 Chief operator here for the past six years has been Mrs. Lavilla McMillan, who will remain in her present position after the dial takeover.
