building after some Torrance veterans killed in World War II. The request was made at Tuesday night's School Board meeting. Coil stated that the Legion had no bone to pick with the present name-selection method but it did feel that the war-dead deserve some kind of recognition.
School Policy
Judge Shidler said that the school policy has been to use short names and street names generally. When names of individuals are used, the selection is made on the basis of valuable contributions to education.
Mrs. Grace Wright, Board member, stated that the Legion has placed the Board in an embarrassing position. "No one can give more than his life," she said, "but we must not forget that there are also other ways of giving."
She referred to the effort that went into obtaining the ideals of an independent school system. Mrs. Wright stated that individuals also deserve honor for their services while still alive.
Judge Shidler injected a vein of serious humor into the proceedings by admitting that it is touchy to honor living individuals by dedicating public institutions to them. A living individual can still get into all sorts of trouble in his lifetime, and this could be embarrassing.
