lar condition such as has arisen here.

The hog issue was stirred up again this week as a result of a letter sent by aroused residents to County Supervisor Burton W. Chace protesting that the hog nuisance had not been improved since recent attempts were made to do so.

The city manager met with Stanley F. Martin, director of the Bureau of Sanitation of the

L. A. Health Department; Ralph Schmidt, president of the Torrance Gardens-Plaza Homeowners Association; Dave Colfelt, area chief of the L. A. Health Department; D. V. Davison of the same department; George Powell, land use investigator; Morris Hattam of the Homeowners group; and Councilman Willys Blount.

Martin stated at the meeting that he would write a letter to the City Council stating his opinion as to any hazard created by the ranches.

Martin has stated that from a health department point of view, the field north of Torrance Blvd. between Maple and Madrona has

been adequately plowed under and he felt that the charge made by the Homeowners that Davison showed an indifferent attitude in remedying the situation was unfair since Davison was instrumental in detecting and eliminating the source of the nuisance.

City Meets Homeowners

In the meantime the City Council met with a delegation of the Homeowners group last night at an agenda meeting to discuss the hog ranch issue further. Councilmen Vic Benstead and Nick Drale asked that a delegation rather than a representative of the group meet with the Council.

Supervisor-Burton W. Chace assured Councilman Willys Blount that he would have his field representative, Richard Newton, check into the local difficulty.
