Labor Contracts Now Negotiating

Negotiations now are in progress on five different labor contracts effecting merchants of the Harbor Area, according to Frank S. Selover, executive secretary of the Harbor Area Employers' Council which is representing the employers in the talks with the unions.

Preliminary meetings were held Tuesday with representatives of Retail Clerks Local 905 on the retail bakery and retail shoe agreements. The union is asking a wage increase of \$3.00 a week on the bakery contract, making the wage \$55 for 40 hours. On the shoe contract, the union is asking a guarantee of \$100.00 per week for managers, an insurance of \$18.00 per week, and \$82.50 per week for salesmen, an increase of \$7.50 per week. Both of these demands were promptly rejected by the employers who are holding out for no increases this year in view of economic conditions.

An employers' conference on the food and liquor agreements with Local 905 was held Tuesday night, but no proposals have been exchanged.

Conferences are being arranged on the Radio, Electronics and Television agreement with International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 11, AFL, which union reopened its agreement.

Selover said that Butchers Local No. 551 decided to push the wage reopening of that contract this year.

All of the above contracts have November 1 expiration dates, except the shoe agreement which expires September 26.
