Bright Lights Outlawed as Of Sept. 9

"On and after Sept. 9 it will be illegal for any vehicle using bright headlight beams to follow within 200 feet of the car ahead," B. R. Caldwell, California Highway Patrol Commissioner stated.

"There has been no change in the existing requirement that all motorists must lower the beams of their headlights when approaching within 500 feet of a vehicle bound from the opposite direction," he explained.

2 Corners to Get Traffic Signals
