

SAFETY AWARD PRESENTED TO STEEL PLANT

Torrance Works of Columbia-Geneva Steel Division was presented with the National Safety Council's "Award of Honor" last week in a brief ceremony at the plant. The "Award of Honor" is the highest award made by the National Safety Council and was presented to Torrance Works for having worked 3,513,436 man hours without a disabling injury during the 37-month period from July 5, 1951 to December 2, 1952.

The award was presented by A. M. Smith, member of the advisory board of the National Safety Council and president of the Southern California Industrial Safety Society. D. E. Rice, general superintendent of the plant, accepted the award on behalf of the employees of Torrance Works.

The following members of the joint management-union safety committee observed the presentation of the award: Charles Donaghan, E. E. Wilson, Frank Smith, W. T. Ayers, and Jess Sullivan. Also present at the ceremony were H. Cook, rescue squad chief; D. H. Hyde, superintendent of industrial relations; George Steele, president of Local 414, USA-CIO; and Robert Wilson, president of Local 2586, USA-CIO.


