Membership
The Torrance Teen-age Club holds dances every Saturday night at the Municipal Auditorium, and the club is sponsored by the Recreation Department of Torrance. The sale of membership cards plus a small admission charge for some of the dances make the entire club self-supporting. Adult leadership is provided by the Recreation Department. Membership cards are sold twice a year in September and March. Membership cards will be on sale for the next two months.

Youths on their way home from this dance will not be apprehended by the police for

being out after curfew as long as they are behaving themselves. But, they must be on their way home from the dance and not loitering along the way.

No intoxicating liquor is permitted at the dance, and the young men are not allowed to wear levis to the dance, nor are the girls permitted to wear slacks.

The Torrance Teen-age Club, originally as the Teen and Twenty Club and later as the Tarter Teens, was organized during the summer of 1949 by Miss Doris Avis and Rex Welch of the Torrance High School faculty while they were employed in the Torrance Recreation Department. Miss Avis has remained as leader of the group, and at the present time is assisted by Miss Joan Melvin. A member of the Torrance Police Department is always in attendance at the dance,

to assist in its supervision.

Sgt. D. C. Cook, of the Juvenile and the leaders of the Teen-age Club want to assure all parents in the Torrance area that every effort has been made in the past

to provide the teen-agers with a well run dance and will continue to do so. All teen-agers are encouraged to attend these Saturday night dances and enter into the social whirl of the youth in Torrance.
