Catch Wife Who Used Car On Husband

Virginia Conway, 22, really didn't mean to assault her husband, Thomas E. Conway, 23, with her car when she flung him down a 15-foot embankment near 209th street and Main street, a couple of weeks ago after her husband hurled a rock through her windshield. In fact, Mrs. Conway just wanted to brush him lightly with her fender or even pick him up because she "loved him," according to the version told Firestone detectives.

Surprise—Arrest

Mrs. Conway, a waitress and ex-Hollywood screen actress, was sought by police for about a week after Conway had been critically injured. A surprise arrest was made Saturday, October 31, when Mrs. Conway had her car serviced at a service station at El Segundo and Figueroa.

The woman came up for arraignment Monday, November 2, and was released after posting \$5000 bail. Preliminary hearing has been set for November 12.

Despite the fact that she "loved him," Mrs. Conway had some rather strong remarks about what she thought of her husband.

Conway, who was severely banged up, is home now recuperating. He has bad scars on his thorax, legs, and ears.

Conway an unemployed movie extra maintained that his wife refused to drive him home, whereupon she assaulted him with her car and flung him down the embankment. Mrs. Conway supposedly made an unsuccessful attempt to drive or back over her husband at the bottom of the embankment.

Mrs. Conway denied that this was her intent. She maintained that she only wanted to hold him till the police arrived and that she left when she saw that her husband was in no condition to run away.

\$13,090 RAISED TO DATE

Community Chest City Chairman, Tommy Thompson of Torrance released his city's collection figures to date at the city chairman's report meeting this week, held at the Dow Chemical Plant.

Thompson's report showed that the city had attained 87.9 per cent of its \$14,899 goal. Torrance has raised \$13,090 to date. "The people of Torrance have responded to this Red Feather Appeal in behalf of the 164 health and welfare services in the Community Chest," Thompson said. "And I am quite confident that they will support us to the utmost in seeing that we reach our quota."

The first city in the Harbor Area to reach the 100 per cent figure was Harbor City, as the city chairman reported \$1,123 solicited as against their \$1,116 quota.

Although Torrance has not reached 100 per cent of one of its division figures, the Advanced Gifts Division, headed by Mrs. Ella Schwartz, reported 100 per

cent of its quota had been met. The final tabulation of the city chairman's report meeting showed that the cities in the Harbor Area had reached the half-way collection mark. Harbor Area Chairman, William C. Bullock stated that \$46,503 of the \$82,664 goal had been reached for a 56.7 per cent of the total.

Bullock also announced that the latest reports received on the complete Los Angeles area showed that \$3,310,407 of the overall goal of \$8,754,000 had been contributed for a 37.81 per cent of the total.
