Dates Set for City Basketball Play

Dates for opening of the Torrance High School Boys' gymnasium for adult league practice periods were announced last Thursday during a meeting of team managers, held in the Torrance Recreation Office. Tuesdays and Wednesdays were established as the regular nights of play. Teams may schedule practice periods through the Recreation Office. First date open for scheduling will be Wednesday, December 2. Deadline for team entry fees to be in was set for December 14. On this date schedules will be drawn for regular practice games between member teams.

At least two six team leagues are expected to play this season, according to Elmer "Red" Moon, city athletic director and league organizer. On the basis of six team leagues, the entry fee per team is set at \$40, which is to cover officiating and trophy costs for a double round robin, or ten games to be played by each team. Teams involved in any playoff games will share equally the additional costs of such games.
