



R. K. LEE CITES WAY TO PEACE

The most potent program for genuine peace that the world can ever know is available today in the Lord's Prayer and the Sermon on the Mount, Richard Knox Lee of London, England, said in a Christian Science lecture here Monday evening, November 16, at Torrance Civic Auditorium.

"The basis of mankind's salvation can never be other than Christ's Christianity," Mr. Lee declared in calling for renewed dedication to pure Christianity. Christianity alone, he said, replaces the materialism responsible for mankind's problems with the spiritual understanding of God, Spirit, in which "lies the power which unifies, liberates, and heals."

Mr. Lee is on an extensive lecture tour as a member of The Christian Science Board of Lectureship. He spoke under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Torrance. Mrs. Marjorie W. Boyd, Second Reader, introduced him. He spoke on the subject "Christian Science: The Supremacy of Spirit."

The spirit of the Lord's Prayer and the Sermon on the Mount "must eventually become the sole motivating power in the government of all the nations of the earth," Mr. Lee said, "for peace and progress, to be permanent, must rest upon the supremacy of Spirit."

When it is universally understood that God is the source and substance of all reality—the Infinite Spirit that created all and made it good—"men will no longer be taught or believe that there is an intelligence, presence, or power other than good, and the phenomenon of evil will disappear," he stated.
