did not think that the city would attempt to close the plant after it was informed of the new plan. The company was introducing measures at this time which will go far beyond the legal requirements, Anderson said.  
 The plant wishes to cooperate with the city and while the city might have had grounds previously for taking issue with the plant, Anderson felt that it would be possible to convince the city now that the company could operate "without any hazard whatsoever to the community."

**Unjustified**

Regarding statements made by Mrs. Arthur Kline, the spokesman for the company said they were wholly unjustified. Mrs. Kline charged that her husband had contracted lung poisoning as a result of working at the plant. Anderson declared that the company had evidence that this was not so. Furthermore, eight other workers working in the same location were said never to have been affected adversely. Mrs. Kline stated that she and her husband were recent employees of the firm.

**Handicraft Clases for Christmas**


