### Rear View Mirrors Compulsory

"If you own a motor vehicle that does not have a rear view mirror you must equip the vehicle with a mirror before January 1, 1954," Commissioner B. R. Caldwell of the California Highway Patrol pointed out today.

According to a new provision of the vehicle code every motor vehicle registered in California after January 1, 1954 must have a rear view mirror which reflects to the driver a view of the highway for a distance of at least 200 feet to the rear of the vehicle.

"This new provision will add importance to the law requiring the driver of any vehicle to dim his headlights when approaching within 200 feet to the rear of any car during hours that lights are required, since every vehicle will have a mirror to reflect the blinding light from bright beams," he added.

### 40th Division Starts Drive For Recruits
