

SAME CORNER SCENE OF 2 SMASH-UPS

A dimly lit intersection was the scene of two serious smash-ups last week, both happening on successive days and about the same time in the evening.

Mrs. Loristine Jessica Anderson, 32, of 4609 Moresby Road, remained unconscious for several hours following a three-car collision at Hawthorne and Torrance boulevards Sunday Nov. 15 at 9:40 p.m. She was rushed to Harbor General hospital suffering a possible fractured pelvis. She was transferred to the care of a private physician later.

David Boyd Lane, 33, a local resident and assemblyman at Douglas, plowed into the right side of the Anderson car which was waiting to make a left turn. Lane was held for drunk driving and charged with a felony.

Saw Car Coming
"I saw the other car coming towards me," Mrs. Anderson recalled, "I was turning, I knew he wasn't going to stop. There was nothing I could do. He hit

my right side and knocked me into the other car waiting on Hawthorne boulevard."

The third car was driven by Jack Bailey, 39, 6087 Pickford place. The car was standing still at the time of impact. Bailey and Lane escaped with minor injuries.

Student Hurlled 381 Feet.
The night before that, Robert Francis Bartley, 19, of 142 Paseo de Gracia, and a student at El Camino college, was hurled 381 feet in his car after it was struck at Hawthorne boulevard by a car which ran the Torrance boulevard stop signal. Bartley was unconscious from the power of the impact. He was taken to Harbor General hospital. His condition was said to be good this week. Bartley suffered from possible head injuries. No head fractures were found.


