SOUTH BAY Recreation Building Area TO GET BOWL Approved

An appropriation of \$10,500 for the construction of a community recreation building in the Avalon-Sepulveda Park, in the Wilmington area was approved Tuesday by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The newly incorporated Pacific Bowl Association, formed for the purpose of providing the more than two million residents of this area with a permanent Bowl and Art Center, will hold a gala Founders' Dinner to be held tonight at 7 p.m. at the Hermosa Biltmore Hotel in Hermosa Beach.

This lavish banquet will mark the formal opening of the Bowl Association's drive for members and funds to erect all the much-needed facilities for all manner of civic, professional and amateur programs. Symphonic, vocal and dance programs are planned as well as Children's and Little Theater Group efforts. The Art Center will house not only an historical museum and library but a full-scale gallery for the display of exhibits by both local and non-resident artists in the fields of painting, sculpture, photography and ceramics.

Founding members and guests will be assured not only of a superb cuisine, spectacular floral decorations in which the Southwest's florists will compete for the grand prize, a star-studded entertainment by many of the most noted names of Hollywood, Broadway and the music world, antique exhibits and the largest hung exhibition of paintings ever presented in the South Bay. Ticket deadline has passed already but additional information may be obtained from Pacific Bowl Headquarters at Frontier 4-1010 or by writing the secretary of the Pacific Bowl at the Hermosa Biltmore before November 29.

The Pacific Bowl Association was incorporated October 6 as a civic, non-profit organization and has, in the first two months of its being, over 5000 applications for membership from Santa Monica to Seal Beach and from Westchester and Inglewood through Bellflower.
