 It took four hours until the four shut off valves could be located and turned off. Until that time, the fire raged full force. Nearby homes, utility poles, and a cafe were wetted down to protect them against the intense heat which kept firemen about 200 feet away from the fire-source.
 D. W. Barkley, job superintendent, said that the machinery caught in the fire represented a loss of \$50,000.
Six Engines
 Six fire-engines responded to the call: one from North Torrance, three from Redondo Beach, and two from the county of Los Angeles.
 One Redondo fireman, Engineer Gilbert Thorns, was overcome by heat prostration and rushed to Harbor General hospital.
