Douglas Sets Second Polio Fund Record

For the second straight year the national record for contributions to the March of Dimes by employes of a major industrial plant has been broken by the El Segundo, Calif., Division of Douglas Aircraft, it was announced today.

Officials of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in Los Angeles said the Douglas employes had given \$16,022.71, highest sum in the nation for an industrial concern of its size.

Polio officials said collections were made at the El Segundo plant and its sister facility at Torrance, Calif., on January 26 in unison with other industries in the 1954 drive.

OK Drain At Special Session

A 40-foot section of the Lomita Storm Drain which extends across the Torrance boundary at 246th street and Crenshaw was approved at a special meeting of the Planning Commission and City Council held Monday night, March 1. The special meetings were called when the "rush" report landed on City Manager George Stevens desk Friday night.

Area Served
The storm drain will serve more than 5000 acres, including Lomita residential and business areas, Narbonne High School, and Torrance Municipal Airport.

Storm waters from the Palos Verdes Hills that flow through Lomita and Harbor City will be controlled through the drain, it was reported.

Route of the drain will be from the Torrance city boundary on the west along 246th street to Pennsylvania avenue and 246th street to 248th street to Lomita boulevard and along Lomita boulevard to the President avenue drain in Harbor City.

Bid
Low bidder on a contract for the construction of the Lomita Storm Drain was the A. Tiechert & Son company of Los Angeles with a bid of \$547,298.04, considerably lower than unofficial estimates of \$950,000 for the project.

A total of 16 bids on the contract were opened.

H. E. Hedger, chief engineer for the Los Angeles County Flood Control District said the bids will be checked and submitted to the board of supervisors at its March 9 meeting for awarding of the contract.

NICHOLSON PROMOTED

Rushed to Korea during the early days of the conflict, the 25th Infantry took part in some of the most bitter fighting on the peninsula. It is now undergoing intensive post-truce training.

Sergeant Nicholson, a platoon sergeant with the 35th Infantry Regiment's Company B, entered the Army in August 1952 and arrived overseas in January. He holds the Korean Service Ribbon with four campaign stars, Combat Infantryman Badge and the UN Service Ribbon.
