JUVENILES CAUGHT IN BURGLARY

Four juveniles were caught in the act of burglarizing the home of Fay Parks, 2530 Eldorado Thursday night. The group was arrested following a phone call reporting a suspicious looking car, according to Police Chief Willard H. Haslam.

The youth in the car, who had been acting as a look-out, was caught by surprise by Officers Bob Wright and Bob Daly, while Officers Joe Miles and Jim Thompson arrested the three other youths.

Three police cars answered the call. The juveniles, all between 14 and 17 years, were turned over to the Long Beach juvenile bureaus where they are wanted in connection with numerous burglaries committed in that area within recent weeks.

Reject Tract Because Of Blind Alleys

Disagreement over blind alleys in a proposed tract at 182nd street and Yukon avenue caused the Planning Commission to reject the layout submitted to them by the Landbar Construction company at the last meeting of the Commission.

The commission asked that the tract map be redesigned so that 185th street will extend through in a northerly and southerly direction to 182nd place and connect to the other streets. It was recommended further that the lots be backed up on the north and south of the Edison company right-of-way and that 185th street be extended in such a manner that it would connect with the tract to the east at some future date.

A spokesman for the company stated that he would like to appeal the Planning Commission's ruling to the City Council. Earl Lloyd, planning consultant for the city, replied that the Commission is not interested in appealing a decision but in getting a design which it considers the best design.
