**Conservation Program Of Oil Advanced**  
California can more than double its vital oil resources by following the best possible production practices, two petroleum experts said and they had a miniature oil field with them to show how the loss occurs.  
Here to advance the cause of conservation were two Richfield representatives, W. J. De Martini and Heyman H. Kaveke, the latter a petroleum engineer. The Richfield representatives addressed a group of Torrance civic leaders and representatives of local service clubs at a dinner held Monday night at the Palos Verdes country club.  
One of the reasons greater efficiency is becoming increasingly important, De Martini said, is the fact that there are so few places remaining in California to look for new sources.  
The most efficient production, the engineer said, is usually impossible unless the field is "unitized," or operated as a single unit, with each interest sharing in the production.  
De Martini pointed out that unitization is at the heart of oil conservation, and added:  
"In the case of oil, conservation means the wise use and the wise management of underground energies, which are indispensable to the production of oil. California is the only important oil-producing state that has no law which ensures this kind of conservation. It needs one."

**Shortcuts In Painting**

Painting is one of the most important steps in beautifying the home. Even inexperienced home owners can achieve satisfying results by following a few simple painting principles of painting practice and observing printed recommendations on the packages.  
Number one is to be sure and choose the right paint for the job. If you are planning to paint a room, the purpose it serves will influence your choice of paint. You may desire to paint woodwork the same color as the wall, this may be achieved by using one of the several types of matching enamels.  
Paint rollers are becoming quite popular with the "Do it Yourself" layman, and they make your job so easy.  
For a professional looking job, remove plates from light switches and duplex receptacles. Painted surfaces should be washed before repainting to remove dust and grease. Allow enough time for surface to dry thoroughly before beginning to paint.  
Old paint which has chipped, cracked or otherwise become rough, should be sandpapered or wirebrushed.  
Any paint dealer will be glad to help you in any way. Just ask him, furnish him with a few simple details, and he can save you hours of disappointing labor.
