'GREEN BELT' PLANNED FOR MINE AREA

Planting will begin soon for a "green belt" to screen diatomaceous earth mining operations on Radar Hill in the Palos Verdes Hills, Paul W. Leppla yesterday told the San Pedro Rotary Club.

Leppla, technical director of the Dicalite Division of the Great Lakes Carbon corporation, said the "green belt" will be several hundred feet wide. Trees and shrubs to be planted, he said, will be well irrigated to speed their growth.

Leppla said the company has appointed one of its staff men as dust control chief and given him authority to shut down operations any time dust becomes a problem.

Leppla real estate subdivision planning for the 6800 acres is still in the embryo stage. He estimated it would be six months to a year before any subdivision work would be started.


