1991 Students Enrolled In Summer School

Summer school attendance reached a total of 1991 students, according to Walter Rehwoidt, director of instructions. This year's enrollment surpassed last year's by 700.
 Enrollment figures break down as follows:
 Seaside, 302; Torrance High School, 238; North Torrance, 167; Carr, 162; WALTERIA, 153; Torrance elementary, 147; Perry, 145; Fern, 134; Riviera, 130; Crenshaw, 128; Wood, 128; Madrona, 88; El Nido, 69.
 Students may enroll in the elementary schools throughout the entire term. High school registration, however, is closed. Classes are intended to help students who are having difficulties with certain subjects or to permit others to explore their special interests.

\$336,954 APPROVED FOR SCHOOL

Federal funds totaling \$336,954 for the Carl Steel elementary school have been approved, according to Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools. The proposed school will be located near Hawthorne boulevard and 190th street in the new Kauffman tract. The school will contain 16 classrooms.
