"Be a Library Space Traveler" is the theme of the summer reading program for boys and girls at the Torrance, Walteria, and North Torrance branches of the Los Angeles county public library.

The Walteria Branch is located at 3815 W. 242 street, and is open from 12:30 to 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on Monday, Thursday, and Saturday, and from 12:30 to 6 p.m. on Wednesday.

Certificates will be awarded to each child who reads and reviews five books. No more than one book a week will be credited.


