Though she threw herself on the ground in order to escape her husband's violence, Mrs. Patricia Friend, 25, did not escape his rage when he leaned out of his car and sent a bullet crashing through her head.

The terrifying scene between Roy Howard Friend, 30, and his wife, Patricia, 25, of 16995 Greville avenue, Lawndale, took place in front of the home of Mr. and Mrs. Earl J. Johnson, 3540 Redondo Beach boulevard, Torrance. The Johnsons are close friends of Mrs. Friend, according to Det. Capt. Ernie Ashton of the Torrance Police Department.

Enters Near Temple

The bullet entered near the left temple and emerged again through the right cheek. Mrs.

Friend remained conscious throughout and was rushed to Harbor General hospital where attendants said she will live, but may lose the sight of her right eye.

Friend raced from the scene after first wielding the gun in Johnson's face, after the latter rushed out of the house. Friend had his two children, a boy, 6, and a girl, 7, in the car when he took off.

Threats

The Friends have been separated and reconciled numerous times, Ashton indicated. This last time Mrs. Friend ran to the Johnson home after her husband threatened to mutilate her and kill her children.

Mrs. Friend was lured to the car when she heard her son calling for her and telling her that he was hungry and had not eaten for a long time.

When her husband told her he wanted \$10 to feed the children, she went to the car and handed him the money. At this time Friend grabbed her. She struggled free and threw herself on the ground but did not escape the single shot which was aimed at her, according to Det. Ashton.






