Proposed New Areas

The following areas have been proposed for being rezoned for retail shopping and commercial use.

A huge square area in North Torrance bounded by 178th street, 186th street, Gramercy

place and Casimir avenue. A rectangular parcel of land bordered by 174th street, 175th street, Amie avenue, and Hawthorne avenue.

And, directly south of this area, a square area bounded by 180th street, 182nd street, Hawthorne avenue, and Roslin avenue.

One other separate area in North Torrance is a flat rectangular parcel to the north of 190th street extending from

about Amie avenue to a spot half-way between Prairie and Florence avenue.

Hawthorne Boulevard

An extensive area considered for rezoning starts at Del Amo boulevard and Hawthorne; it continues one block wide down the east side of Hawthorne till Emerald; here it broadens out to Amie; at Maricopa it broadens out again to Madrona, continuing about one block south of Torrance boulevard where it doubles back to Amie, plunging down a straight line to Sepulveda. The west side of Hawthorne boulevard intended for rezoning starts at Torrance boulevard and Earl street, which line is extended all the way south to Sepulveda. From Sepulveda south the proposed Hawthorne boulevard commercial zone tapers down step-like until it reaches 228th street where the borders straighten out all the way down to 238th street with Neece avenue for a western boundary and approximately Park street for an eastern boundary; at 238th street the zone expands west to Wilmington street and east to Madison, south past Highway 101, the southern border being a line drawn from Bluff and Wilmington to Madison and Highway 101.

Airport Triangle

Also intended for commercial purposes is the "airport triangle" on the east side of Crenshaw boulevard on Highway 101.

Two other areas on the south side of Highway 101 opposite the airport are also intended for commercial rezoning. One is a triangular piece roughly bordered by Tandem way, Danah street and Highway 101. The other is a rectangular area between Dalemead and Highway 101 east of Rolling Hills road.
