New Trailer Court Locates In Lomita

Mr. and Mrs. Howard G. Miller have completed the first 45 spaces of their new 4-acre de luxe Rolling Hills Trailer Park fronting on Crenshaw boulevard and Pennsylvania avenue at 248th street in Lomita.

The park is designed for 72 spaces. It has three individual islands, 30x50-foot lots, unique street lighting, all underground wiring, large patios, ultra utility building, chain-link fencing, and landscaping.

"We mean to make the park a discriminating park for modern trailers and particular tenants," Miller stated.

Rolling Hills Trailer Park is within walking distance of the postoffice, shopping areas of Lomita and the new \$15,000,000 shopping area to be built on the Torrance Airport land at Crenshaw and 101 Highway.

Because of the storm drain being put down Pennsylvania avenue, the temporary entrance to the park is 248th street and Crenshaw boulevard. Despite this temporary inconvenience several trailers have already taken up residence in the new park.
