

TORRANCE MOOSE LODGE SAFETY CONTEST ENTERS FINAL WEEK

The Torrance Moose lodge judging committee will start work next week on rating the numerous entries in the local division of the Moose International Youth Safety Award contest, according to Joseph Piatt, governor and civic affairs chairman of the lodge.

"This contest could be instrumental in making the youth of Torrance more safety conscious," Piatt said, "and the judges will have a difficult time selecting the boy or girl who has done the most outstanding safety service in this area for the period of this contest."

Who Eligible

The chairman again stressed the fact that a boy or girl need not have performed an act of heroism to be eligible in this contest. "A good record in the

school safety patrol, the writing of a safety theme, the designing of a safety poster, or any other such performance gives him or her a chance in this contest," he said.

The local winner will be presented with a parchment-like scroll, with his or her name individually embossed, and will then compete with more than 1700 other local winners throughout North America for the four grand prizes.

These grand prizes include free, all expense round trips to either New York or Chicago to appear on a coast-to-coast radio and television show, gold wrist watches, and a proposed trip to Washington, D. C., and the White House.
