Head-On

Both cars were extensively damaged.

Sailor Critical

In another crash, a sailor was injured critically when the car in which he was riding crashed into a fire hydrant on Pacific Coast highway at Paseo de Gracia late Sunday night.

Listed as critical at Harbor General Hospital is Guy D. Lazzaro, 18, a sailor stationed at San Diego. Lazzaro suffered concussion and multiple lacerations of the face.

He was a passenger in a 1953 Jaguar.

Driver of the sports car was Reed A. Walker, 29, of Beverly Hills, who was cut on the face and hands.

The car left the pavement and hit the fire hydrant, according to police reports. Thousands of gallons of water spilled out over the pavement and flooded the car.
