

Public Forum To Feature EC Speakers

Two El Camino college instructors will address the Torrance Public Forum series in the final two Wednesday evening presentations of the season, November 3 and 10.

No charge is made for admission to the lectures, held in the Fern School auditorium at the corner of Elm and Dorado streets. Sponsored by the Torrance Council P-TA, the program is presented by the Torrance Evening High school.

Lectures start at 7:30 p.m. John A. de la Haye, coordinator of instruction at El Camino will address the forum next Wednesday evening, speaking on the subject, "Democracy Working in a Hostile World." "A Look at Our Political Future" will be the topic of Albert S. Karr, instructor in history and government at the local college. He will speak November 10, concluding the four-lecture series. Karr opened the forum series in October speaking on the subject, "Why Two Parties?"

Alondra Park Improvement Announced

Plans for the development of seven regional parks as major recreational projects throughout Los Angeles County will proceed as soon as possible, it was announced today by B. P. Gruendyke, County Superintendent of Parks and Recreation.

In the Second Supervisorial District, represented by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, it is proposed to establish a Regional Park in what is now Alondra Park.

County Chief Administrative Officer Arthur J. Will has been authorized by the Supervisors to select the park designers who will ascertain the best reasonable recreational improvements which can be established in the seven locations.

RECREATION PROGRAM AT PARKS OUTLINED

Torrance Recreation Department announced today that its fall and winter recreation program is well under way with afternoon and evening recreation programs at Walteria and McMaster parks, and afternoon programs at El Retiro Park and Seaside school.

In the Torrance High School gymnasium a program of badminton is held every Monday night in the girls' gym, also on Monday night the boys' basketball in the boys' gym. Thursday night mixed volleyball is held in the boys' gym.
