PROTEST NURSERY CLOSING

Protesting the state's closing down of the Guys and Dolls nursery here, a number of parents requested that the City Council aid them in getting the nursery's license restored.

Mrs. Margot Bergmann, owner of the nursery, and spokesman for the parents, questioned

the manner in which the inspector from the Social Welfare Department of the State of California inspected the nursery. It was claimed that the nursery was closed by all the regulations of the city. The Council was asked to intervene on behalf of the nursery with the state agency. The Council directed City Manager George Stevens to check whether local regulations have been abided by and then to write the Social Welfare Department and ask for an explanation of its action. Residents claim that their own letters were not answered.
