Victim Plays Peek-A-Boo With Bandit

An unorthodox "now-you-see-me-and-now-you-don't" act by his intended victim so unnerved a gun-totin' robbery suspect last week that he made an about-face and quit while he was ahead.

The victim A. W. (Bill) Travers, proprietor of a liquor store at 1644 Pacific Coast Highway, told Harbor police that a gunman entered his store Tuesday night at 10:30 p.m. and announced, "I want all the money you got, or I'm going to have to come back and get it."

With that unpleasant dilemma to ponder over, Travers replied, "I guess you'll have to come back then," and without further ado, ducked quickly behind the counter.

The bandit's preconceived notions thus being all fouled up, he stalled a moment and then stalked out of the store and drove away.

Travers was unable to describe the man to police—he had been daring enough to duck but had no further desire to peek, being glad to let well enough alone.
