A breakdown of local campaign results reveals that major contributions this week were made by commerce and industry forces working under the direction of Sam Levy and Warren Hamilton. The co-chairmen reported a total of \$4,028 raised to date, which represents 58% of their quota and a 24 per cent increase over last week's returns.

An increase of two per cent in residential solicitation was noted by Mrs. Schwartz, who said that another \$1500 must be raised by door-to-door and advanced gifts volunteers before the 11,373 residential goal is reached.

Those living within Los Angeles city territory are now burning between the hours of 4 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Unincorporated areas in Los Angeles county will start burning from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. starting December 4, according to action taken by the County Board of Supervisors.
