### Developers Offer 7-Acre School Site

A snag in Don Ja Ran's home construction plans seemed ironed out recently when the company tentatively agreed to provide for an elementary school site in the Hollywood Riviera district.

Though the school district originally hoped for a 10-acre site, it was satisfied to settle for a 7-acre parcel at a cost of \$7500 per acre, according to Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools.

The board has asked for the site to be near Palos Verdes boulevard, but the exact location will be determined later.

The firm is planning a housing development on the acreage near Palos Verdes boulevard, but the tract maps have been held up by the Torrance Planning Commission pending determination of a school site.
