Normally a four-page six-column weekly, the Warhoop has expanded to eight pages, contracted to two-pages extras with glaring headlines, and resorted to color and fragrance in covering the unfolding tale of its Junior Rose Bowl gridiron heroes.

Banner headlines in blue and black boldly announced the El Camino-Bakersfield battle for roses Thanksgiving day, in a special Homecoming edition distributed both on campus and to Warrior rooters at the game. A player enveloped by a sleek football was superimposed in blue over the center of the first page.

Warriors returning to campus following the hotly-contested Bakersfield game were greeted by a "holiday special" edition of two pages which proclaimed "EC gets Junior Rose Bowl Bid" in bold inch-high letters, seldom utilized in conservative Warhoop makeup. Action shots of game and post-game activities enlivened the extra.

A special eight-page edition saluted the Bowl-bound Warriors prior to class time. Bordered by red roses, the issue was scented with rose perfume. More than 36 merchants of the communities surrounding El Camino announced the college's achievements to the staff in financing the special.


