Child Burned, Help Needed

On November 20, 1954, Carol Lynn Howard, 2½, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Earl Howard, 1911 Middlebrook, was severely burned while her sister, Kay,

was celebrating her twelfth birthday. The cake had been lighted and while the party guests were having refreshments, Carol climbed up on her high chair and took a box of safety matches from a high shelf. She slipped out the back door quietly and while attempting to light the incinerator her clothing caught fire. By the time Carol reached the house for aid, her clothes were completely burned off. Carol was treated at Torrance Memorial Hospital until Tuesday, November 23, and then transferred to Children's Hospital where she is still on the critical list. The doctors have stated that she is over 50 per cent covered by third degree burns. Doctors are performing skin graft as often as her condition permits. There are three other children in the family—Kay, 12; Larry, 7; and Sandra Lee, 10 months old. The father is employed at Douglas aircraft, but has been unable to work since the accident occurred. The parents have kept a constant vigil at the hospital. Because of their heavy hearts and ever increasing hospital and doctor bills there will be little or no Christmas for those at home. We, the neighbors of Carol, would like to help. We are calling on you, the residents of Torrance, asking you to say Merry Christmas to Carol with a dollar bill. Tips For Holiday Shoppers Issued By Highway Patrol

In keeping with seasonal themes, the California Highway Patrol today issued a list of "Helpful Tips" for holiday shoppers. Bernard R. Caldwell, Commissioner of the Patrol, explained that there were more deaths, more injuries, more traffic accidents, and more pedestrians injured during December than any other month last year. He offered the following helpful, life-saving hints: 1. Never combine alcohol with Christmas shopping, whether driving or walking. 2. Refrain from window shopping or searching for addresses while driving. A second's inattention may cost a life. 3. Stack packages in vehicles so they will not block the driver's view and will not topple over, creating driving hazards. 4. Never attempt to make up for lost time by speeding. Excessive speed is the number one killer in traffic today. 5. When walking, do not carry packages that will obscure your vision ahead or to the sides. A car may not miss the pedestrian who didn't see it. 6. Remain constantly alert.
