



Artistic Christmas Mosaic On Display At EC College

First in order of display and last of the six unique reproductions to be featured in the traditional display of El Camino college's Madonna Row is a six by eight foot mosaic depicting the Madonna and Child.

With the five mural reproductions of previous years, the mosaic will be displayed before the El Camino administration building, 16007 S. Crenshaw blvd., through the holiday season. Well-lighted, the display may be viewed from automobiles of passing motorists 24 hours daily.

City Council, School Board Hassle Over School Signals

Trying to fix responsibility for the purchase of school traffic signals is turning into a volleyball game as of late, with the ball passing back and forth between the City Council and the Torrance Board of Education.

No sooner had the School Board expressed a we-won't-pay attitude, even on a 50-50 basis as requested by the city in connection with one traffic signal, than the City Council plunked another request for a traffic signal, square into the Board of Education's lap. This latest request is for a

traffic signal at 187th street and Crenshaw blvd.

Councilman Willys Blount soliloquized that the latest request would carry considerably more weight than any previous requests, since it comes accompanied by a petition signed by 803 residents.

The petition, submitted to the Council, will be forwarded to the Board of Education.

Nightmares

The councilmen maintain that the School Board should at least stand 50% of the cost, since the problem is strictly a school problem, especially at 187th st. and Crenshaw.

With its unique Madonna Row lighted and ready for display, the college will observe an active season. Included in the busy program of events are students, faculty and administrative staff members, and other campus employees.

The art attractions, all featuring the Madonna and Child, line the front of the Administration building, 16007 South Crenshaw boulevard, and are lighted throughout the night to enable passing motorists to view the unusual art presentation.

Added to the traditional Madonna Row display this year is a newly-prepared mosaic reproduced from art work dating back to 300 A.D. Prepared under the direction of Miss Mildred K. Walker, art instructor, the mosaic is one of six art re-

productions of the college. Each is 6 by 8 feet in size and stands 8 by 10 in its gold frame, prepared by members of the college custodial staff.

Previous works have been painted. Featured are reproductions of Botticelli's "The Virgin and Child," Gian Battista Piazzetta's "Virgin and the Child," Raphael's "The Cowper Madonna," El Greco's "The Virgin with Santa Inez and Santa Tecla," and Jan Van Eyck's, "Ince Hall Madonna."
