Dr. Jauncey is well qualified to speak on this subject and is widely known as a lecturer, preacher and educationist. He is an English born Australian and has been engaged in educational evangelistic and Bible Conference work in this country since 1948. He spent the early part of his life on pioneer farms in the Australian bush where as the oldest of 15 children he learned from hard experience what the struggle for survival means in primitive conditions.

His college education was won in competitive scholarship examinations, and background for the Christian ministry. Jauncey took bachelors degrees in Arts, Science and Divinity, proceeding to graduate degrees in each of these.
