PARKING LOT INQUIRY ORDERED

Investigation of possible traffic hazards to children along Atkinson street caused by openings onto Atkinson from the Food company market parking lot now under construction at 174th street and Crenshaw has been seriously hurt, according to Harbor General Hospital officials.

This action followed submission of a petition protesting the openings signed by numerous homeowners in the area.

The Council will investigate whether the openings onto Atkinson are in violation of the original agreement with the city. If so, construction on the lot will be ordered halted.

A check will also be made to see if the wall is extended out too far or whether sidewalk space has been dedicated.

An ordinance was also asked to be drafted to keep all heavy vehicles off residential streets in the area.

A further meeting on the matter was set for April 26 at 8 p.m. in the Council chamber.

Local Man In Exercise 'Apple Jack'

Sergeant First Class Waymon A. Grigsby, son of Mr. and Mrs. William H. Grigsby, 1852 Regina ave., Torrance, is among 26,000 soldiers slated to participate in Exercise Apple Jack during May at the Yakima Firing Center near Fort Lewis, Wash.

Apple Jack will test the efficiency of infantry and support units in mountainous and desert terrain. The simulated use of atomic weapons will be one of the conditions of the exercise.

Sergeant Grigsby, a platoon sergeant in Company H of the 2nd Infantry Division's 23rd Regiment, entered the Army in August 1952 and completed basic training at Fort Ord, Calif. He is a holder of the Purple Heart and Bronze Star Medal.

Car Hits School Bus, 18 Children Injured

Held to face felony drunk driving charges after hitting a school bus Thursday afternoon in which 18 school children were injured is David P. Hannaman, 29, of 161 E. 214th st.

The accident occurred at 186th street and Western avenue, according to Los Angeles police.

None of the children were seriously hurt, according to Harbor General Hospital officials.

Hannaman was treated for face cuts which required 30 stitches and possible internal injuries.

Thomas Waller, 39, of Los Angeles, driver of the school bus, had just picked up 79 children at the 186th street school and was taking them home.
