Judge Addresses P-TA Meet

Judge Joseph Raycraft was guest speaker at the recent meeting of the Leland street school P-TA. His topic, "The Law, the Parent, the Child," dealt mainly with the influence of parent behavior upon the child, and effect divorces had upon children.

Judge Raycraft went on to state, "Stop the problems behind divorce, and you stop divorce... problem children are the result of divorce." He also pointed out that the laws of California are primarily concerned with the welfare of the child.

Preceding the address in the auditorium, the large attendance of parents visited the classrooms during an open house, and visited with the teachers while they viewed the children's work on exhibition.

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
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
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
