REVISED RECREATION FACILITIES PROPOSED

In order to work within the \$150,000 bond budget, the following improvements and changes will be made at Torrance recreation areas, as recommended by William Woollett, architect hired by the city.

These plans have been submitted to the Recreation Commission and will be acted on by them and the City Council.

SEASIDE PARK: Fencing around three sides; grass area over golf course portion; manual sprinklers; road and parking area with oil and rock finish; club house; walks, rock and oil; grading. Total: \$61,000.

ELIMINATED WERE: Automatic sprinkler system; utility building; paved parking lot; lawn planting cut down; curbs changed at road; cement walks changed to gravel walks; pump house; planting on slopes; part of the fencing; building cut down. Total: \$19,650.

EL RETIRO: Two cement

tennis courts; equipment and incidentals. Total: \$12,000.

ELIMINATED WERE: Night lighting; dry well; springler changes; center rail on fence. Total: \$4,200.

WALTERIA PARK: Club house; cement finish patio and concrete block wall; walks, rock and oil. Total: \$26,000.

ELIMINATED WERE: Cut-down on building improvements; concrete walks; utility building... change fence cap to concrete; change patio wall to a fence and plant shrubbery or ivy. Total: \$7,950.

McMASTER PARK: Drive and parking lot of rock and oil; revised club house; existing sprinkler system only; baseball back stops (now installed) moved to new location and fencing. Total: \$143,000.

ELIMINATED WERE: drive and parking lot; Pergola tile; barbecue; planter boxes; utility building; fencing around parking lot and road; outfield fencing; drinking fountain; removing play ground equipment; lighting; building. Total: \$17,250.

Local Fishermen Fight Japanese Tuna Imports

A number of Torrance, Lomita, and Harbor City fishermen and their families are among those who are presently alarmed at competition from Japanese tuna fishermen and are trying desperately to get the United States to intervene by placing a higher tariff on foreign imports.

"Our own boats are standing idle in the harbor with tons and tons of tuna," Mrs. Johnson said. "Our fishermen are losing thousands and thousands of dollars, because the canneries are buying fish from the Japanese boats at a much cheaper rate."

"The families of our fishermen are suffering. The men are out on a run from three to six months and now they are losing money and can't provide for their families," Mrs. Johnson stated.

A committee headed by Mrs. Andrew Zitco of San Pedro is presently trying to get state and federal help in meeting this competition.

"If the fishermen don't make money, the local businessmen won't make any money either


