Plans for a proposed 49-bed community hospital which would cost \$507,000 and which would be located on the Torrance Municipal Airport property are presently under study by a committee of the Airport Commission.

Plans for a proposed \$507,000 49-bed community hospital to be located on the site of the Torrance Airport property are being studied this week by a committee for the Torrance Airport Commission.

A petition for a site, with 300-foot frontage on Pacific Coast Highway, was presented at the last meeting of the commission. The frontage length was left flexible. The Howard S. Miller company of Los Angeles, building contractor, submitted the proposal.

Herman Light, AIA architect for a number of modern hospital buildings including University, Bella Vista and some of the newer units of Harbor General Hospital, was named as designer of the proposed Torrance hospital.

Walter Metzger, administrator of Mt. Sinai hospital and nationally known as an authority on hospital management, would be consultant for the new hospital, the petition stated.

Two major reasons advanced for the location on leased airport property are: It would be easy to find, and the site "would be ideal because it is located on a major traffic artery having a bus line."

Chairman Robert C. Herrick of Hollywood Riviera, chairman of the Airport Commission, placed the matter in the hands
