### Approval Of \$450,000 Harbor Funds Expected

The final passage by Congress of an initial appropriation of \$450,000 to begin construction of the long-awaited Redondo Beach Harbor will bring to a climax almost 10 years of a hard-fought, singlehanded effort by Congressman Cecil R. King to get federal authorization and appropriations for the needed project.

The House Appropriations Committee last week approved funds for the harbor after being persuaded by Congressman King that the Redondo Beach project was necessary to safeguard the city's valuable shoreline from severe oceanic erosion.

Under present planning the federal government will put up more than \$5,000,000 toward the harbor development and local interests will be required to finance some \$2,000,000 of the project.

The United States Army Engineers have announced that construction can start immediately after July 1.

"This harbor development program will not only provide shoreline protection for Redon-
