Approve Plans for 560 Homes

Approval of plans for \$7 million worth of homes here was granted by the City Council in action Tuesday night. Tract maps calling for the construction of 560 homes by the Milton Kauffman company in the west section of the city were okayed following a recommendation for approval by the Planning Commission.

The two, three and four-bedroom units will be built on a tract of land bounded by Anza avenue, Torrance boulevard, Sepulveda boulevard, and the western city limits.

Approval of plans for 57 homes by the Watt company was withheld by the Council pending further investigation of street sizes and alignments. The Watt tract is slated for a site near 186th street, near Crenshaw.

Candidates Sought For Academies

Torrance boys interesting in competing for appointment to West Point, Annapolis or the new Air Force Academy were told this week to get in touch with U.S. Senator Thomas H. Kuchel. The Senator has announced that he will have vacancies to fill in all three defense service academies in the class entering in 1956.

The civil service examinations, on which Senator Kuchel bases his nominations, will be held in various California cities and towns July 11. Youths desiring to take the test should communicate with the Senator's office without delay so that necessary forms can be sent them on which to gain entrance to the examinations.

The Senator's allotment of nominations comprises two to the Military Academy at West Point, one to the Naval Academy at Annapolis, and 10 to the Air Force Academy in Colorado.

Tax Law Benefits Torrance

Torrance stands to profit handsomely from the new state legislation establishing a uniform sales and use tax, according to a statement made by Councilman Nick Draie at Tuesday's Council meeting.

Draie declared that the city can lower local property taxes by at least three cents per \$100 value when the law becomes effective this year.

In Lieu Tax
 The new law empowers the county, instead of individual cities to levy and collect the .01c tax. Collection and disbursement of the revenues will be handled in the same manner as

gasoline in lieu taxes, Draie said. The county will collect the entire tax and return it to each city on a basis of population.

New Revenues
 At the same time, Draie added, the new use tax will bring the city added revenues.

Teachers Get Salary Hike

The Torrance Board of Education in a regular meeting last Tuesday raised the minimum salary for beginning teachers from \$3895 to \$4050. This new figure compares favorably with the minimum salaries of other districts in Los Angeles County, the Board disclosed.

Beginning teachers with a master's degree have a beginning salary of \$4350. Teachers with 36 semester hours beyond the master's degree may start at a beginning salary of \$4650. The maximum salary on the schedule is \$6570. Annual pay increments have been raised from \$154 to \$160 per year, it was revealed.

The Torrance Y-Wives will meet at the Long Beach YWCA at 10 a.m. tomorrow, Friday, June 17, for an hour of swimming followed by refreshments. Children of those attending will be cared for at the Long Beach Y.
