**Schneider Given Local Carbide-Carbon Post**

The promotion of Carl Schneider to the position of assistant superintendent at the Carbide and Carbon Chemicals Company's new plant in Torrance, was announced this week by E. J. Fox, superintendent of the Carbide plant in Texas City. Prior to receiving his new assignment, Schneider served as an area supervisor at the Texas City plant.

Schneider, a chemical engineering graduate of Yale, first started with Carbide in July, 1934, at the South Charleston plant.

In January, 1935, he was transferred to Whiting for the start-up of the Carbide plant there and he remained at Whiting until February, 1947, when he came to Texas City as an area supervisor.

A resident of Texas City, Schneider is married and has three sons, Carl, Jr., 19, Bob, 16, and Doug, 8.

The Torrance plant, which is now under construction, was first announced by Carbide in July, 1952, and it is estimated that it will start up in the Fall of 1956.

It is estimated that when completed, the plant will produce from 50 to 60 million pounds of polyethylene a year, and from 5 to 10 million gallons of ethylene glycol.

It is estimated that the California plant will give employment to from 250 to 350 persons.

**Conditions Placed On Edison Co.**

Provided a letter is received from the Edison company agreeing to put an eight-foot masonry wall around three sides of the building, the Planning Commission agreed to approve an Edison company substation at Sepulveda and Madrona avenue.

Objections to the substation were voiced in the form of a petition with 31 signatures submitted by F. H. Elliott, of 3402 West 224th street.

The station, he said, would cause property depreciation, would be a nuisance and hazard to children, and would weaken zoning restrictions.

Lou Jenkins, Edison company manager, said that the 16 by 24 foot building would in no way be a hazard; nor that it would interfere with radio or TV reception in the area.

The station, he said, would reduce current from 16,000 to 4000 volts for use in the area. No employees or trucks will be needed, he added.


