6800 Students Expected At El Camino

Nearly 3000 students have enrolled for classes at El Camino college at the close of the first week of general registration, and 40 of the 800 classes to be offered during the fall semester have already been filled and closed.

Registration figures are expected to mount to 6800 before the final day of registration, Forrest G. Murdock, president of the college, has indicated.

Observing the heavy early enrollment, college officials cautioned students who expect to enroll in more than a limited program to make immediate arrangements with college counseling offices. Delay in doing so will make it difficult or impossible for the student to obtain a suitable schedule, students were advised.

Until September 7, registration will occur from 1 to 4 and 5:30 until 8:30 p.m. each Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. On Thursday and Fridays, registration will take place between 8:30 and 11:30 a.m. and 1 and 4:30 p.m.

New students under the age of 18 were advised by the registration office to present verification of high school graduation.

All new students must file with the director of student personnel an application for admission and at transcript of high school and college work taken previously. They must also take scholastic aptitude and qualifications examinations applicable, and must telephone the counseling office for appointment to register if enrolling for 10 units or more.

Information regarding necessary tests and examination schedules may be obtained when calling for the appointment, W. Holmes Smith, assistant director student personnel explained.
