building activity here will probably reach the unprecedented \$65 million mark by the end of the year.

This means an increase over last year with its record-breaking \$45 million total.

Sixth Place

For the first six months of the year Torrance stood in sixth place among 73 Southland cities surpassed only by Los Angeles, San Diego, Long Beach, Anaheim, and Fullerton, respectively.

Through the month of July, the building total for the year amounted to \$28,633,219, which put 1955 \$8 million ahead of '54's total for the same period.

Regarding Torrance building policy, particularly as it applies to home construction, Russell stated:

"Los Angeles county standards are the highest in the country and that's what we've set up here now."

Increased revenue from other sources and cutting down the losses of the bus department through the addition of new equipment and a fare increase account for the 5 cents saving in the general fund, Stevens stated.
