United Evangelistic Crusade Scheduled

Forty leading Harbor area pastors and more than 200 volunteer workers will complete organization details this week for the grand opening of the united evangelistic crusade to be conducted by Evangelist Pete Riggs of Jacksonville, Ill., at Vermont and Pacific Coast highway starting Sunday, September 25, at 3 p.m.

General chairman, Rev. Herbert W. Ezell, pastor of the Wilmington Boulevard Assembly of God church predicted that the 22-day interdenominational crusade in which 40 churches in the communities of San Pedro, Wilmington, Lomita, Harbor City and Torrance are united, will be the "most significant event of its kind ever held in the harbor area."
