**Pacific Smelting First To Contribute to Chest**  
First firm in Torrance to contribute their "fair share" quota in the 1955-56 Community Chest campaign is Pacific Smelting company, according to John Ebbinghouse, Torrance commerce and industry chairman. In accepting a check for \$650 from Pacific Smelting's vice-president, M. D. Schwartz, Ebbinghouse expressed hope that the contribution would be a "pace-setter" for other Torrance firms to follow in the Red Feather appeal on behalf of 168 agencies. Jack Schmidt, Pacific Smelting plant manager and a Chest commerce and industry committeeman, was instrumental in obtaining the generous contribution for the Chest, and will also serve as employe Chest chairman for the firm. Pacific Smelting has operated under the present management in Torrance since 1943. Red Feather solicitors this year are asking firms to contribute on a "Pro-Rata Share Plan," Ebbinghouse explained. This plan, based on business trends, profits, previous giving and employment, answers the question often asked by firm executives, "How much should we give?" "In pro-rating the Chest goal among all firms, the plan is a sincere effort to equitably distribute the financial responsibility for vital health and welfare services."

**Resources Show Gain**  
California Bank's total resources increased \$137,170,297 during the past twelve months to reach \$790,243,888, according to the bank's statement of condition for October 5, A. O. Otsea, vice president, said. The bank's deposits totaled \$735,427,028 on October 5, a gain of \$124,051,868 during the twelve-month period. Loans and discounts amounted to \$297,540,247, an increase of \$106,384,731. Capital funds advanced from \$30,109,323 to \$43,399,915, consisting of capital stock \$14,805,050, surplus \$19,200,000, and undivided profits \$9,394,865.


