Chest Goal Announced

Phillip Lisman, city chairman for the 1955-56 Community Chest campaign in Torrance, announced today that the city's goal will be \$5070 in the Red Feather appeal.

This amount is part of the harbor area goal of \$85,070 and the goal for Los Angeles Community Chest of \$9,500,000, the largest amount ever sought for local health and welfare services, according to Lisman.

Actually, the amount necessary to meet the most critical needs of the 168 agencies united in one time and money saving campaign is greater than the goal set, according to Allen Harper, chairman of the volunteer Chest budget committees. "The Chest goal is trying to

catch up with the continually expanding area. We are very much aware that more people mean more problems, and pressures for services are such that many of our agencies have long waiting lists," he said.

The importance of the preventative services of Chest agencies was stressed by Allen Harper.

"We spend millions for treatment of all kinds of social ills . . . delinquency, disease, dependency . . . and pennies for prevention. Prevention is constantly limited by lack of sufficient community support."

In endorsing these statements, Lisman pointed out that there are 18 Chest agencies located in the harbor area, as well as many others throughout Los Angeles which extend health and welfare service to harbor area residents.

Municipal Chest Drive Heads Told

Mrs. Bernice Goodwin, public employees chairman for the 1955-56 Community Chest campaign in Torrance, announced this week that James Crowther of the Torrance city garage and Stanley Fogarty of the city engineer's office, will serve as committeemen to assist her in Chest solicitations.

Also to aid in the Red Feather campaign among Torrance city employees are the following volunteers: Mrs. Ladeene Chamberlain, city manager's office; Mrs. Maxine Herman, police department; Mrs. Bernice Florence, police department; Mrs. Violet Whittington, recreation department, and Mrs. Jean Wren, fire department.

In a letter to Torrance city employees, Mrs. Goodwin stated, "We (city employees) are more directly affected by the well-being of our community than is the average resident of our city . . . We know that anything that helps the City of Torrance helps us."

She then went on to list some of the benefits received by residents of the Torrance area from the Community Chest, citing 383 Torrance children treated at only 3 of the 168 Chest agencies—California Babies' and Children's Hospital, Children's Hospital and Orthopaedic Hospital—and 10,929 veterans served by the Torrance Veterans' Service Center.




